Offers English, Math, & ESL assessments, free student IDs, prerequisite clearance, pre-requisite challenge petitions, and academic/progress dismissal counseling.

Counseling Services

Counselors review students' requirements for associate degrees and certificates and assist students in class selection and overcoming academic barriers.

Financial Aid Office

Provides financial aid application assistance and processing, determines financial aid eligibility and awards, and distributes financial aid packages, including fee waivers.

Assists students transitioning from welfare to academic advisement, on-campus child care assistance, work study, and school supply supplements.

Offers career assessment, internships, job searches, resume, cover letter help, and interview tips.

Disabled Students Program & Services (DSPS)

Provides academic services and accommodations to students with verified disabilities, including priority registration, academic counseling, testing accommodations and more.

International Student Program

Transfer Center • SSB 229 • (323) 241-5392

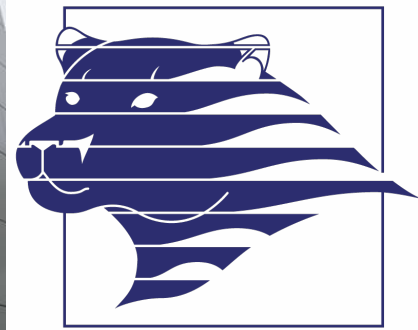
Provides information on transfer programs, general education requirements, advisement, application assistance, and connects students with college and university representatives.

Student Success Center

The Student Success Center offers free academic support, such as land based and online tutoring and success seminars to all currently enrolled students. The center has computers to provide students the technology to conduct research and complete class assignments.

Math Lab

Specially Funded Programs, TRIO

Educational Talent Search

SSB 116 • (323) 242-5521

Provides low-income, potential first-generation students from local middle and high schools with advisement and educational services to ensure a high school graduation and post-secondary education.

TRIO Scholars Program

SSB 229 • (323) 241-5392

Assists low-income, disabled, and first-generation college students to transfer to four-year institutions. Provides counseling and academic advisement, tutoring, transfer workshops, field trips to four-year colleges, cultural activities and transfer assistance.

TRIO STEM Project

SSB 229 • (323) 241-5392

Supports students interested in science, technology, engineering, mathematics, or allied health majors. Offers counseling and academic advising, supplemental instruction, field trips to four-year colleges, and transfer assistance.

Upward Bound

Assists low-income and first-generation high school students in LASC's target area with academic advising and tutoring, cultural and recreational field trips, and a six-week summer academic academy.
