Dr. Lisa Cooper Wilkins


Dr. Lisa Cooper Wilkins has served students for nearly 30-years. She has cultivated a career of service with an emphasis on access, equity, and inclusion. An Aspen Presidential Fellow and a Lakin Fellow, she is a culturally responsive leader deeply committed to the transformational power of the community college. She believes it is her responsibility to advance authentic conversations about race that will close the opportunity gaps. Currently she is Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs at CCSF; previous positions include Assistant Superintendent/Vice President of Student Services at Delta College, Dean in Academic Affairs at Community College of Philadelphia, Assistant Vice President for Diversity & Community Engagement, and Interim Assistant Provost at UOP. She holds a doctorate from George Washington University. Her awards include the Education Champion Award in 2018 from the San Joaquin Pride Center and the NAACP's Medgar Evers Freedom Fighter Award in 2017.



Alton D. Scales

Alton D. Scales earned a Master's of Science in Manufacturing Engineering and a Bachelors of Science in Engineering Technology from the University of North Texas.

His titles have included President, Vice President of Academic Affairs, Assistant Vice President of Diversity and Inclusion, and Director of Enrollment Management. He has served community colleges and four-year institutions in Colorado, Pennsylvania, Kansas and Texas. He is the lead consultant for Capitol Peaks Advisors LLC a consulting firm. He has had a positive impact on the processes and systems of numerous colleges and universities as an Academic Quality Improvement Program team facilitator.
